What's Going On?

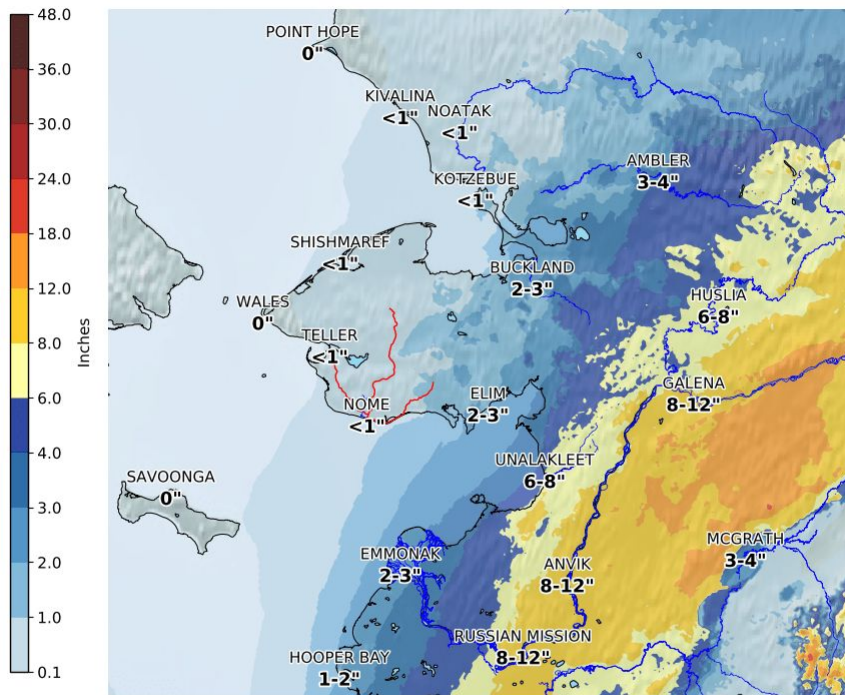
- Heavy snow continues for portions of the Interior.
- Heavy freezing rain continues in McGrath with light amounts of snow expected.

Impacts through Sunday PM

- Additional snowfall totals of 6 to 12 inches with the highest amounts expected above 2000 feet.
- Additional freezing rain up to ~0.50-0.75 inches in McGrath with lighter amounts possible northeast towards Minchumina.

Expected Snowfall - Official NWS Forecast

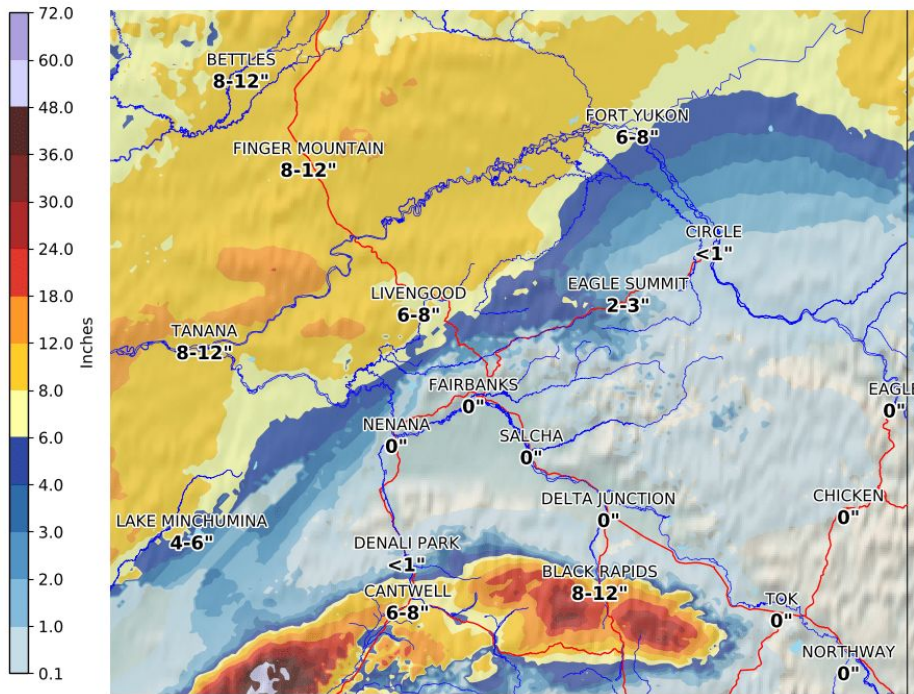
Valid: This Evening thru Sunday Night



- Heavy snow will continue across the Western Interior with the lightest amounts around McGrath and towards the Western Alaska Range.
- The highest totals will remain above 2000 feet of elevation.

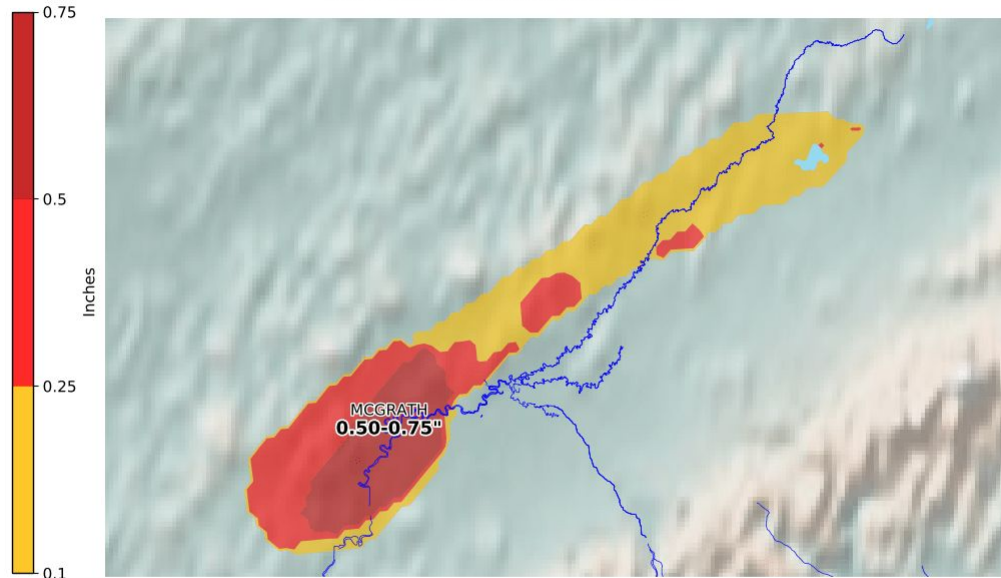
Expected Snowfall - Official NWS Forecast

Valid: This Evening thru Sunday Night



- Heavy snow continues north and west of Fairbanks from the White Mountains to the Brooks Range.
- Heaviest snow totals be in the higher terrain at 2000+ feet.
- No snow is expected in Fairbanks through Sunday Night.

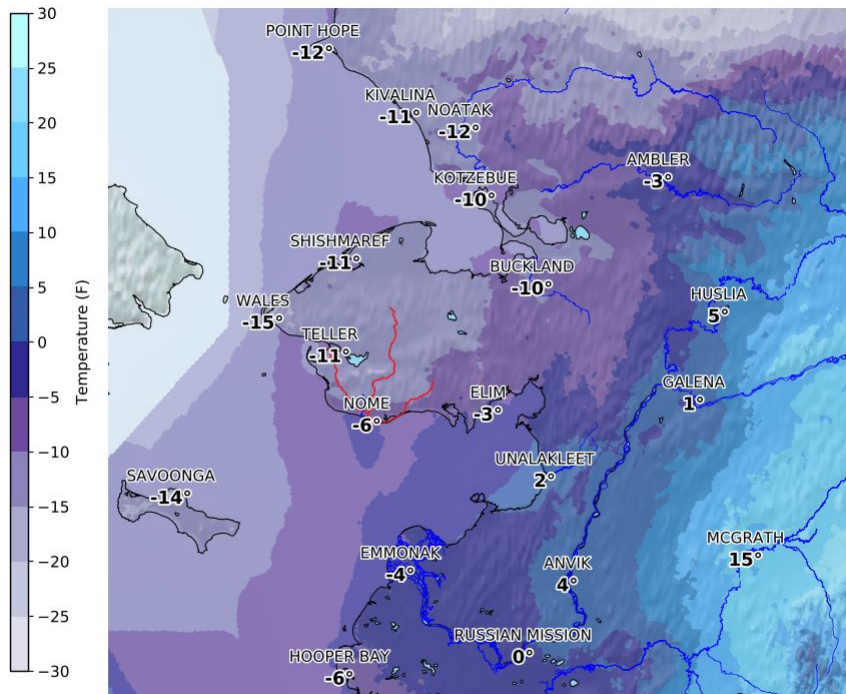
Expected Ice Accumulation- Official NWS Forecast Valid: This Evening thru Sunday Night



- An additional 0.50-0.75 inches of freezing rain is expected in McGrath.
- Lighter amounts of freezing rain around 0.10 inches is expected in Minchumina.

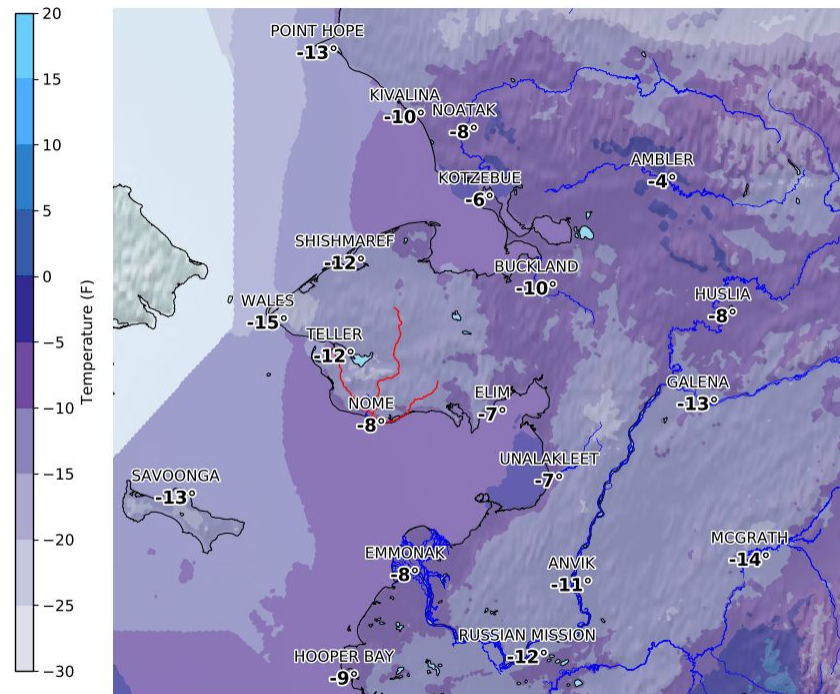
Monday Morning Lows

Valid: January 27, 2025



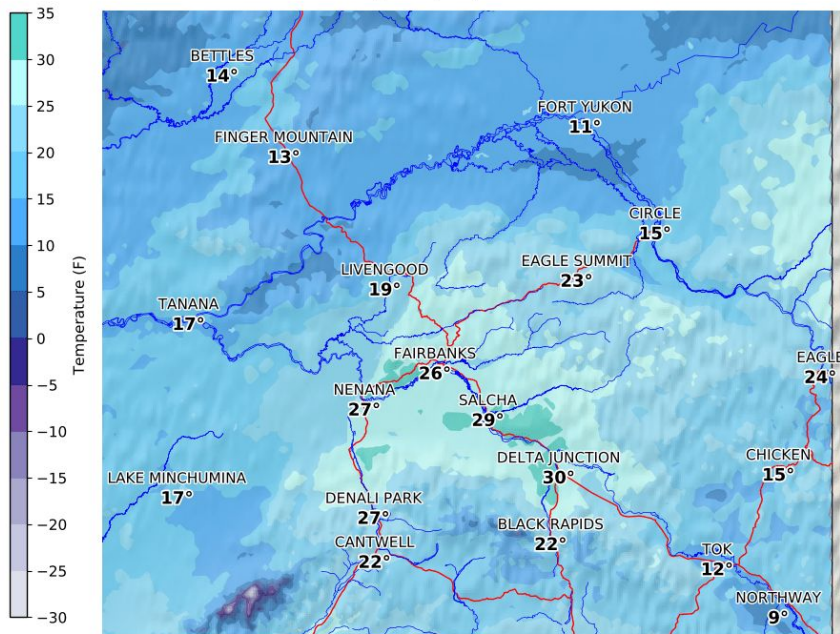
Tuesday Morning Lows

Valid: January 28, 2025



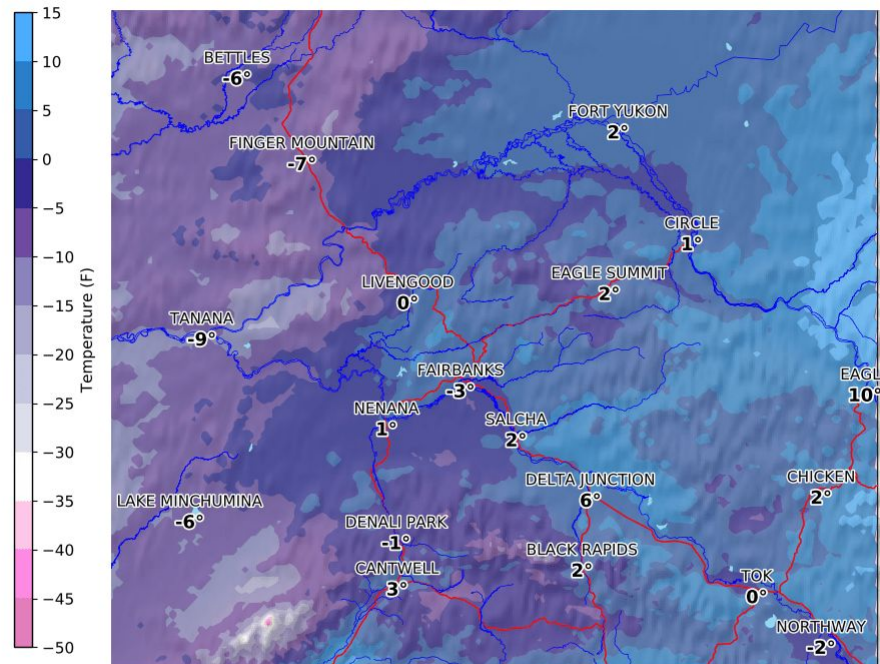

Post-Storm Forecast - Western Alaska

Weather Forecast Office
Fairbanks, AK
Saturday, January 25

- Light snow on Monday with an additional 1-3 inches of snow everywhere, including McGrath.
- Temperatures drop well below freezing Monday morning.
 - Any standing water will likely freeze quickly.
 - Temperatures drop well below zero by Tuesday morning with widespread minimum temperatures in the -20s and -30s across the area.
- Colder and drier weather persists through Friday, then there may be another round of snow possible next weekend.



Post-Storm Forecast - Central Interior

Weather Forecast Office
Fairbanks, AK
Saturday, January 25

- Light snow on Monday with an additional 1-3 inches of snow likely.
 - Around 1 inch of snow expected in Fairbanks.
- Temperatures drop below freezing Monday morning.
 - Any standing water will likely freeze quickly.
 - Temperatures drop to near/below zero for most locations Tuesday morning.
 - Minimum temperatures by Wednesday will likely be in the negative teens to -20s.
- There will be light snow possible from Fairbanks east Wednesday and Thursday, though accumulations likely remain around 1 inch.
- Colder and drier weather persists through the weekend.
